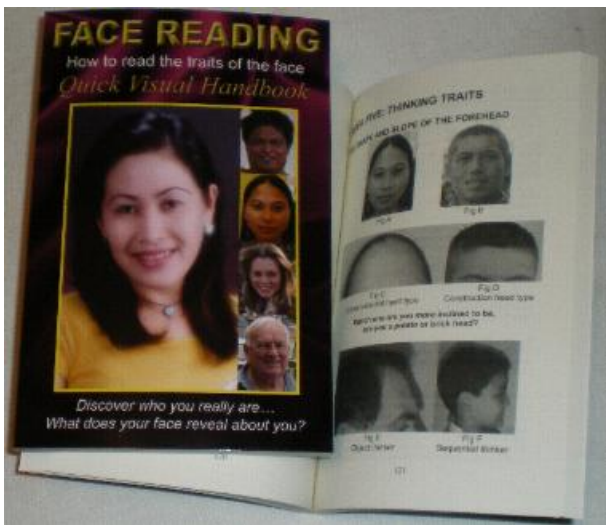


USING THE KNOWLEDGE OF PERSONOLOGY IN SOLVING DOMESTIC PROBLEMS, REDUCING CONFLICTS
