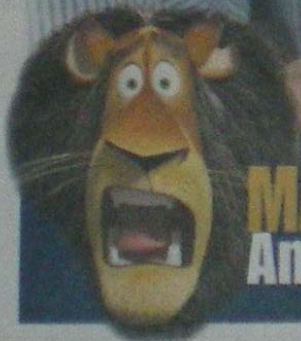

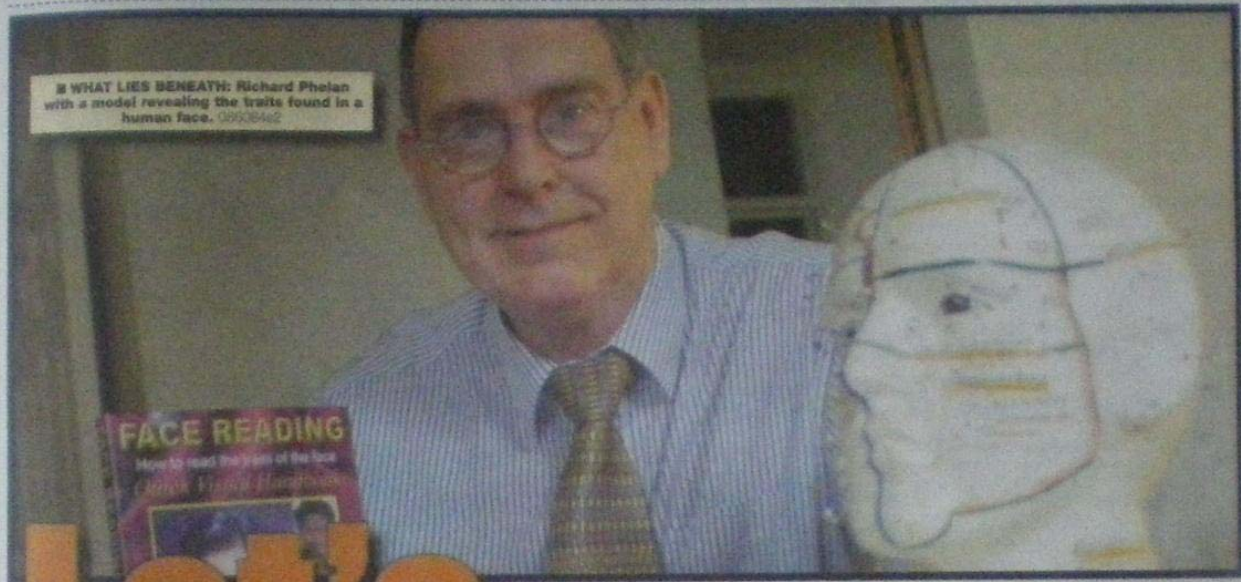

Let's face it

ANNE-MARIE CANAVAN meets a man who discovers the person within – via their face

IT HAS often been said that the face never lies, and no one believes this more than personologist Richard Phelan. The 57-year-old has been researching and studying people as a hobby for many years – but really began to focus on face reading after a trip to China. The dad of two said: "I started studying face languages, face reading or facial genetics – known as personology – after my visit to China in 2001, where I met several face reading experts. "People give away many signs and signals as to how they think and reason, and what their true attitude and motives really are." Mr Phelan – who grew up in North London – had previously been a carpenter for GlaxoSmithKline in Maidenhead, but says he has been interested in learning about people since his teens. He studied in San Francisco, USA, under Neema Tinkle at the International Centre of Personology as well as Dr Paul B Eberly, who carried out scientific studies. Mr Phelan said: "I use the methods pioneered by the late Judge Edward Jones, who was the original investigator of genetic traits, nose and head physical features. "I have not found anything that has been able to match the

system for accuracy, and I have investigated and talked to a lot of people." Personology is not based on intuitive or psychic readings, but is supported by scientific research and studies for more than 70 years. Personologists look at the face and read inherited genetic traits which helps to understand human behaviour and personality. The face is split up into five categories which deal with physical, automatic, action, emotion and feeling and thinking traits. A personologist looks at hair thickness, leg length, hand dexterity, nose, chin, eyes and lips to determine what typical traits a person is likely to have. "There are no bad traits – there are good traits and traits that are out of control. "We all have many gifts and great potential. Personology gives you the knowledge to look at yourself and see how to cultivate the very best in you and bring out the very best of your traits," said Mr Phelan. The residents of Normys Drive, Maidenhead, says the practice of personology is widely used in the USA, but is not so well known here, and he hopes his new book Face Reading will help to widen people's knowledge of the theory. He also says that anyone who is cynical about it should try it themselves.

He added: "You will be amazed by what you learn. With your new knowledge you will be able to understand who they really are and why they do the things they do. "Your communication with others will greatly increase and should be successful, with few conflicts."
